For one who is inflamed with divine love, helping the neighbor in his needs is a fever that consumes him by degrees.

May the Holy Family never withdraw its loving gaze from you and your family. Model yourselves on it, and you will have peace and spiritual and temporal well-being.

When the soul grieves and is afraid of offending God, it does not offend him and is very far from committing sin.

4

Divine grace is with you continually, and you are very dear to the Lord. Shadows and fears and convictions to the contrary are diabolical stratagems, which you should despise in the name of Jesus.

Cast away those fears, and dispel those shadows which the devil is increasing in your soul in order to torment you.

6

If we earnestly endeavor to love Jesus, this alone will drive all fear from our hearts, and the soul will find that instead of walking in the paths of the Lord, it is flying.

7

How consoling it is to know (that) one is always under the protection of a heavenly spirit (our guardian angels) who never abandons us, not even (what an admirable thing!) when we are actually offending God!

How delightful this great truth to the one who believes! Who is to be feared, then, by the devout soul who is trying to love Jesus, when accompanied by such an illustrious warrior?

9

Was he not one who joined with St. Michael to defend God's honor against Satan and all his rebellious angels? ... (Our guardian angel) is still powerful against Satan and his satellites. His love has not lessened, and he can never fail to defend us.

10

Make a habit of thinking of him (your guardian angel).

11

When it seems that you are alone and abandoned, do not complain that you are without a friend to whom you can open your heart and confide your woes. For goodness' sake, do not forget this invisible companion who is always there to listen to you, always ready to console you.

12

The finest grace that can be asked by and on behalf of those who aspire to the spiritual life (is) ... an increase of heavenly light.

13

(Heavenly light) cannot be acquired either by prolonged study or through human teaching, but which is directly infused

by God.

14

When a righteous person obtains this (heavenly) light, it comes to know and love its God and eternal things in its meditations with extreme clarity and relish.

15

Although (heavenly) light is nothing but a light of faith, it is still sufficient to produce such spiritual consolation that the earth, in the first place, disappears from view, while all that this world can offer is seen to be worthless.

The most useful, fruitful, and also the most acceptable way to the Lord is precisely that: To ask Jesus to make us holy is neither presumption nor audacity, because it is the same as desiring to love him greatly.

17

The fears that arise, as to whether you spent your time in the presence of God well or otherwise, are without foundation. And dwelling on this is a true waste of time that could be used for holier and more fruitful matters.

18

If you want to become perfect, always keep present in your mind what God said to Abraham: *Walk before me, and be blameless.*

19

Let us refer all our actions to (God); let us raise our souls to him more often.

20

Let us carry our Christian actions more often along with short prayers. In short, let us refer everything to God, and let us act and live in him.

21

Live calmly, and do not worry excessively, because in order to work more freely in us, the Holy Spirit needs tranquillity and calm.

22

Every anxious thought is a mistake ... The Lord works within you, and you must do nothing except leave the door to your heart wide open so that he might work as he pleases.

23

The desire to be in eternal; peace is good and holy, but you must moderate this wish with complete resignation to divine will.

24

It is better to do the divine will on earth than to enjoy paradise.

25

To suffer and not to die was St. Teresa of Avila's motto. Purgatory is sweet when one suffers for love of God.

26

The trials to which the Lord is subjecting you at present and those to which he will subject you in the future are all countersigns of divine love and jewels for the soul.

27

(Spiritual) darkness (of the soul seeking to do God's will) is an indication of the closeness of God to your souls ... the Jewish people saw (God) in the form of a cloud, and he appeared in the temple as a cloud also.

28

God's hiding himself in the darkness means his making himself more clear to your gaze, and that from his being visible and intelligible he becomes transfigured into the purely divine ...

29

The first virtue required by the person who is striving for perfection is charity.

30

In the supernatural sphere, the first movement of our hearts is a movement toward God, which is nothing more than loving our own true good.

31

With good reason Sacred Scripture speaks of charity as the bond of perfect harmony. Charity has as its close relatives joy and peace.
