O Holy Mother, Padre Pio of Pietrelcina loved you with a childlike love and sought your almighty intercession in his life. As a Spiritual Child of so holy a child of God, I ask you to accept me as your child, though unworthy, and protect me. Accompany my every step and protect me from all evil. Lead me to Jesus, that in the Spirit of the Lord, I may enter the Father solving embrace forever. Amen
